Modernising Schools with Science Laboratories

The European Commission announced the completion of the project entitled "Modernising Schools with Science Laboratories – Primary Education" at a ceremony held on Wednesday, 29 September 2021, at Merkez Lefkoşa. The project is part of a bigger programme valued around 5 million Euros for the establishment of laboratories in primary and secondary schools with the aim of supporting the Turkish Cypriot community in the field of education and science. Within this first stage of the project, science laboratory equipment (including a science bus), materials, and software have been supplied to 48 primary schools in the Turkish Cypriot community.


Online Workshop on Zero Pollution for a Sustainable Future

In this context, free consultancy, training, and cooperation opportunities are offered to micro and small businesses that are members of KTEZO.

A short-term grant scheme for micro and small enterprises was opened to support businesses benefiting from the "Dayanışma" Business Development Support and to implement the knowledge and experience they have gained within the scope of the service. The overall objective of the grant scheme is to increase the competitiveness of micro and small enterprises in the Turkish Cypriot community. Grants that can be requested under this programme will be between 10,000 and 20,000 Euros.
