Europe Day Celebration – 9 May

The EU Infopoint marked Europe Day with a special celebration held at its premises in Nicosia.

Held by invitation only, the event brought together local stakeholders, decision-makers, media, EU-funded Technical Assistance projects, NGOs, and representatives from the Turkish Cypriot community and international partners.











Europe Day 2025 Celebrated at Ledra Palace Buffer Zone in Nicosia

Europe Day 2025 was celebrated on 10th May at the Ledra Palace buffer zone in Nicosia, with an exciting lineup of activities, dance, and live music performances. This annual event, now a cherished tradition, aimed to promote core values such as peace, diversity, cultural heritage, and unity—values that lie at the heart of the European Union and resonate strongly with both the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities.

The festivities featured a rich cultural programme, including performances by renowned local artists and specially curated activities for children. The event began at 15:00 with a captivating performance by the Songbirds Intercommunal Children's Choir. This was followed by a video message from Raffaele Fitto, Executive Vice-President for Cohesion and Reforms, and in charge of Cyprus Settlement Support. The opening remarks by Raffaele Fitto were followed by speeches from Charalambos Prountzos and Mehmet Harmanci.

Following the speeches, the LBO Kids Choir performed, followed by a dance presentation by Cypriot dancer Dinos Kkanti, who showcased his world-famous Glass Balancing Dance—a discipline in which he recently set a Guinness World Record. The remainder of the main stage programme featured performances by the LBO Jazz Trio, PAOK Klirou Folk Dance Group, the HASDER Folk Dance Group, and Grup Otantik. The evening concluded with a lively performance by the renowned Cypriot band, Angelos Avgousti and Friends.

In parallel with the main stage events, a vibrant children's programme ran throughout the day, featuring activities such as a puppet show, a workshop on renewable energy, a treasure hunt, a handicrafts workshop, face painting, and other fun-filled activities. Participants also had the opportunity to visit various stands to learn about the opportunities and projects financed by the European Union. Additionally, the EU member states' stands provided an opportunity to discover more about the countries of the European Union.

EU Aid Programme Info Day in Güzelyurt/Morphou

The EU Infopoint successfully organised an Info Day on 21 June in Morphou/Güzelyurt to raise awareness about the support provided to the Turkish Cypriot community under the EU Aid Programme. Funded by the European Union, the event offered local residents the opportunity to learn about current and upcoming EU-funded projects, while highlighting the EU's long-term commitment to the Turkish Cypriot community.

The day began with an indoor session held in the centre of Morphou/Güzelyurt, bringing together civil society organisations, small and medium-sized enterprises, farmers, and residents. Participants received information on a wide range of EU-supported initiatives, including education, agriculture, scholarship programmes, and support for SMEs and CSOs. From 19:00 onwards, EU-funded projects joined the annual and much-anticipated Orange Festival, where a dedicated EU corner featured stands representing various EU-funded Technical Assistance projects.

Visitors had the opportunity to learn about completed and ongoing projects, as well as future initiatives aimed at benefiting the community.


























EU Aid Programme Info Day at Mormenekşe Artichoke Festival

April 2025

June 2025

As part of ongoing efforts to promote multilingualism and cultural awareness in line with the European Day of Languages— celebrated annually on 26th September— a German language workshop series was organised in June 2025.

These fun and interactive workshops introduced children to the basics of the German language, including everyday words, simple conversations, and aspects of German culture.
